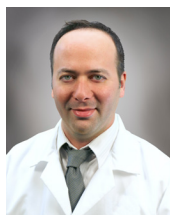

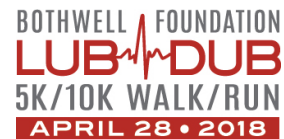
- **Bothwell Wound Healing Center** recognized by Healogics as a Center of Excellence.

BOTHWELL EXPANDS PATIENT SERVICES

HOSPITAL ACQUIRES SEDALIA INTERNAL MEDICINE SPECIALISTS

On Jan. 2, Bothwell Regional Medical Center acquired Sedalia Internal Medicine Specialists, a pulmonary and nephrology clinic at 1712 S. Lafayette Ave. in Sedalia.

“The decision to acquire Sedalia Internal Medicine Specialists came after careful consideration with the clinic physicians and our Bothwell internal medicine providers,” said Keith Morrow, vice president of clinic operations for Bothwell. “We believe this combination is a great fit for everyone involved.”

For patients, little will change except the name of the clinic — to Bothwell Internal Medicine Specialists.

“Patients will continue to see the same physicians and receive the same outstanding care at the clinic,” Morrow added. “But they also will get the added benefit of access

to all the additional resources the hospital provides.”

Providers at Bothwell Internal Medicine Specialists are Dr. William Woolery, M.D., who specializes in pulmonary disease; Dr. David Wuellner, M.D., a nephrology specialist; and Rene Boland, a clinical nurse specialist in adult health.

BOTHWELL TO OPEN WALK-IN CLINIC AT HEALING ARTS CENTER

Residents in the area will soon have another health care option as Bothwell is preparing to open a walk-in clinic at the Bothwell Healing Arts Center, 3700 W. 10th St. Plans call for the new clinic to be opened in mid-February.

Keith Morrow, vice president of clinic operations for Bothwell, said it will be used to treat acute problems such as skin rash, flu symptoms, earache or a sore throat. Patients also can get a sports physical at the clinic.

Morrow said the clinic will help connect patients without a primary care provider to Bothwell physicians who are accepting new patients.

The clinic will be open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday through Friday, and 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Saturday. It will be staffed with a nurse practitioner and clinical and clerical staff.

Clinic visits will cost less than a trip to the hospital’s

Emergency Department and will help to free up ED staff for critical care needs.

For example, the ED sees a high number of patients with flu symptoms. Those patients can be better treated in the walk-in clinic, which would allow doctors and nurses more time with patients that have time-sensitive needs such as a heart attack.

“We’re trying to provide access to the community as much as possible,” Rose McMullin, Bothwell’s interim CEO told the Sedalia Democrat. “It’s a constant thing, because physicians get full. When you’re busy and everyone’s sick, you have to have more available access for patients in the community and that’s what we’re trying to do.”

HOSPITAL PICKED TO HOST RURAL MEDICAL RESIDENCY PROGRAM

The University of Missouri recently selected Bothwell as the site of a new rural residency program.

Bothwell was selected over Hannibal Regional Hospital and Lake Regional Hospital at Osage Beach for the program.

Chief Medical Officer Dr. Philippi Fracica announced Bothwell’s selection at the Board of Trustees meeting Jan. 22.

He said the residency program won’t begin for at least 18 months

to give time to build the curriculum. Bothwell will have to find a program director and achieve accreditation.

“(MU) felt that we were most ready and we were most prepared, and a lot of that has to do with the degree of support that we got from the community and leadership,” Fracica said.

Bothwell has hosted three third-year medical students on rotation for the past year. Two of the students have expressed interest in returning to

the hospital to practice medicine in the future.

Through the rural residency program, Bothwell will now be able to host medical residents who are in training to become specialists.

“The importance of that is medical students tend to practice within a fairly close proximity to where they did their residency,” Fracica said.

Board Chairman Cam Jennings said the residency program could help Bothwell with physician recruiting.
