Bothwell restructures security department

One of Bothwell's strategic goals for Fiscal Year 2019 has been to revamp security at the hospital. For several

months senior leadership met to map out a new direction for the department.

The top goal was to restructure security in a way that would best ensure the welfare of employees, patients and

the public. Rather than continue to contract with an outside company to provide security guards, the hospital decided to make officers Bothwell employees. One of the first hires earlier this year was John DeGonia as director of security.

DeGonia most recently served as Chief of Police for the past 12 years for the City of Sedalia. Since starting at Bothwell, DeGonia has been involved in hiring several of the new security guards.

"The guidelines and qualifications are stringent for the hiring of security officers," he said. "The staff is comprised of retired police officers, corrections officers and armed security from other hospitals. We also have a former director of security from another hospital."

DeGonia said that for years, hospitals typically did not have armed security officers. Today, though, more and more hospitals are using armed security to better prepare for and prevent any armed encounters.

"First and foremost, our words and our demeanor are the best weapons against someone making things difficult in the hospital," DeGonia said. "We seek first to treat them with respect and offer them options to help the situation."
