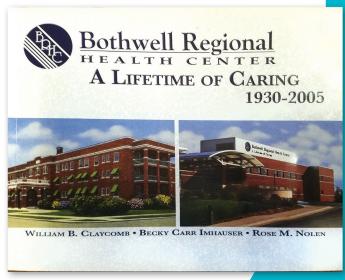

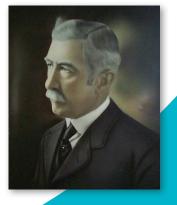
A Letter from Lori

Nolen, chronicles Bothwell's first 75 years and is a terrific resource to understand how the hospital began and how it has grown. If you're interested in the rich history behind the hospital, I highly recommend it!

Today, the hospital has been in existence for nearly 90 years. John Bothwell and other early supporters, along with physicians and staff imagined a community hospital, but did they envision what it looks like today? In September, a planning team comprised of internal and external Bothwell stakeholders will begin meeting to develop **Bothwell Forward**, a strategic plan for 2020–2025. The team will meet regularly through the end of the year, and the work will be facilitated by the Callis team.

The planning team will begin by reviewing and discussing the results of the **SWOT** (**Strengths**, **Weaknesses**, **Opportunities and Threats**) survey that was sent to all employees, board members, foundation directors, and community, educational and health care continuum partners earlier this month.

Next, we will analyze at least **four future scenarios** that present important uncertainties that may drive change and that Bothwell could face in the next 15 to 20 years. This work will help identify **specific focus areas** and establish **annual objectives.**

Scenario planning is a valuable tool in strategic planning as it encourages us to look to the future and imagine how we will do business and operate the hospital if certain situations happen. Think about how you plan for your own futures—jobs, homes, children and moves. Doesn't looking to the future help you think about the steps you need to take today to get where you want to be?

Once a final draft of the plan is created, I will share it throughout the hospital network to get feedback, and then it will be presented to the board in January. When the plan is finalized, I challenge each of you in your own departments and clinics to know and model Bothwell's vision. The new strategic plan will be an excellent resource to develop goals and ideas for the work you do every day to serve your patients, your colleagues and your communities.

Now, it's our turn to do our part—to imagine the future and make solid plans to keep Bothwell moving forward while staying true to its roots as a community hospital.

MYBOTHWELL HEALTH How to Sign Up to Access Your Information

Keeping track of medical information is now easier than ever with the Bothwell patient portal and the MHealth app. After setting up your portal, you can view scheduled appointments, exchange messages with providers, request refills on medication and view information such as lab results and discharge instructions. The portal makes it easy for patients and their authorized users to access medical records while keeping all information safe and secure.

In order to enroll in the portal, an email must be on file with Bothwell. If it is not already on file, patients can stop by the Medical Records office on

the ground floor of the hospital from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday or any Bothwell clinic office. Upon registration, patients will receive a one-time password link via email to complete the setup process.

Once the initial setup is complete, patients can access their record via brhc.org by clicking on the MyBothwell Health tab or through the MHealth app.

HIGH-RISK ULTRASOUNDS NOW OFFERED AT BOTHWELL

Bothwell Regional Health Center is excited to announce that the Sedalia facility is now capable of performing high-risk ultrasounds. With this addition, patients can stay local and will not have to travel out of town to get the care they need. The results will still be sent to Columbia to be read, but patients can enjoy the convenience of having the procedure done closer to home. Adding this service will allow Bothwell to help more mothers have healthy pregnancies and healthy babies. We would like all our providers to be aware of this change so patients can start taking advantage of this service immediately.



IDENTIFICATION CHANGE Fetal Demise Recognition

We would like to make everyone aware of a change in designation that will be happening in Labor and Delivery. Instead of the butterfly image that has been traditionally placed on the doors of mothers who have suffered fetal demise or loss, Bothwell will now use the leaf and water image to the right.

This change is being made to align our practice with hospitals around the country, as this graphic is the nationally recognized symbol for this occurrence. This symbol serves as a notice the mother and family have suffered a loss, and it is a reminder to be especially sensitive during a very difficult time.

EMPLOYEE SPOTLIGHT: PATIENT FINANCE ASSISTANT

Holli Bircher

Bothwell welcomes Holli Bircher to the Bothwell team as a patient finance assistant. This is a new position created to assist our patients as they navigate through their medical care.

This position offers unique assistance as Bircher helps patients with applying for various medical coverages such as: Medicare, Medicaid and Marketplace insurances prior to leaving the hospital.

"I work daily with patients to help navigate through the processes by helping them fill out complicated applications, submit forms for faster processing and assist with submitting required documentation to the agencies," Bircher said.

Bircher works with a variety of patients including new mothers to make sure new babies have the medical coverage needed.



Along with applying for insurances Bircher helps connect patients with prescription assistance and community resources if needed to ensure patients continue to receive care once they are out of the hospital.

This position bridges the gap between our Social Work department and the Finance office to better serve the patients that need assistance.

"I make ongoing connections with our patients to support the improvement of health and health care in our community," she said.

JUST TEXT US

Patients to Receive Text Reminders

How many times do you hear your friends and family say "Just text me?" Texting has become a nearly universal form of communication with people spending 26 minutes a day texting, compared to about six minutes on voice calls.

Beginning in September, all Bothwell clinics and central scheduling will begin using WELL, a new tool that will automatically text appointment reminders to patients.

"We are excited to once again offer text appointment reminders," said Keith Morrow, Clinic Operations vice president. "When the hospital's Electronic Medical Records (EMR) system was updated last July, the ability to send text reminders was no longer available. With WELL, we can provide this service again to patients."

At the time a patient schedules an appointment, clinic and central scheduling staff will use the tool to text a confirmation to the patient. A week prior to a patient's appointment they will receive a reminder text and be asked to confirm their appointment. Patients can confirm, decline or reschedule their appointments by responding to the text message. If they must reschedule, patients will be able to text the Bothwell team back to schedule another day or time without calling or waiting on hold.

"If a patient doesn't respond to the initial confirmation text message, the system will send additional reminders up until the day before the appointment," Morrow said. "This is a value-added service to patients to help them remember their appointments and allow them the opportunity to reschedule appointments via text at a time that's convenient for them."

Benefits of the new tool include a reduction in appointment no-show rates; reduced staff time to make appointment confirmation calls; and increased feelings of connectivity between patients and providers.

"Implementation of WELL aligns perfectly with the services provided by our new central scheduling system," said Lori Wightman, Bothwell CEO. "It takes a routine task like appointment reminders and automates it, saving time for both patients and staff and freeing up time for complex issues and a human touch."





Bothwell Regional Health Center is now using the #1 trusted communication platform that connects patients to health care organizations.

FLU VIRUS UPDATE

Due to a late-emerging flu virus, this year's vaccination shipment will be delayed up to four weeks.

The A/H3N2 influenza strain has been reported in the southern hemisphere, so the WHO and FDA delayed their selections of the flu strains to be included in this year's vaccinations by one month. In that time, researchers were able to collect data on the A/H3N2 virus and improve the match of the vaccine strain to the live virus to formulate a more effective vaccination.

With this delay, Bothwell's pharmacy supplier, Sanofi Pasteur, expects delivery of their vaccines to run three to four weeks behind schedule. Partial shipments are expected to begin in September, with shipments complete by the end of November.



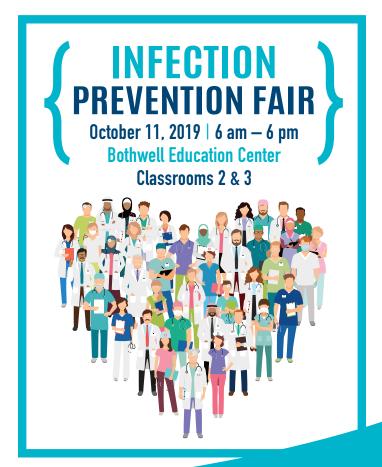
