MEDICAID EXPANSION INITIATIVE A Letter from Lori

Earlier this month I participated in a conference call with Healthcare for Missouri hosted by the Missouri Hospital Association.

Healthcare for Missouri is a coalition of voters and patients, medical professionals, business leaders, and organizations committed to expanding access to health care to Missourians. On Sept. 4 the organization launched a November 2020 ballot initiative to expand Medicaid in Missouri. Missouri is one of 14 states that has not passed this measure.

Medicaid expansion would deliver health care to thousands of additional parents, senior citizens and working families who earn less than \$18,000 a year. These families earn too much to qualify for Medicaid and not enough to be able to afford coverage on the health insurance exchange.

The campaign will need to collect more than 172,000 signatures to be eligible for the ballot next November, and signature gathering has begun.

SURGICAL CAMP to Debut in October

Bothwell Regional Health Center will begin offering new Surgical Camp classes in October.

"Preparing for surgery can be an anxious time for patients and their families," said Lori Wightman, Bothwell CEO. "Surgical Camp is an innovative program, modeled after Bothwell's successful Joint Camp, that provides information to patients about their surgical procedures and allows them to ask questions and understand what to expect prior to, during and after the surgery."

Classes for Surgical Camp will be offered from **8 to 9 a.m. Oct. 21**, **Nov. 4, Nov. 18, Dec. 2, Dec. 16, and Dec. 30** in the Bothwell Education Center at 600 E. 14th St. in Sedalia.

"Surgical Camp classes are free to patients planning to have surgery this year at Bothwell," said Stacey Robinson, Bothwell Nurse Educator/Recruiter. "We highly recommend that patients enroll in a class. The information provided can put patients at ease knowing their questions have been answered and what to expect before undergoing surgery."

IMPORTANT CHANGES

INSURANCE ENROLLMENT

Open enrollment is scheduled from **Oct. 21 through Nov. 8,** and it will be done **online** and not on paper. Human Resources will email employees the link to re-enroll by the start of the open enrollment period.

Classes also are being scheduled for those who would like to learn about the changes to this year's health insurance or who need assistance with the online enrollment process.

Other important information to note:

- This year, all employees who receive health insurance benefits MUST RE-ENROLL in the offered health insurance plan(s). If you do not re-enroll during the open enrollment period of Oct. 21 through Nov. 8, you will not have health insurance coverage in 2020.
- There will not be a benefits fair this year.
- You do not need to re-enroll in dental, vision, disability, or life insurance plans UNLESS you need to make changes to your coverage.
- Employees who wish to participate in the Flexible Spending program are required to enroll for the 2020 plan year.
- Open enrollment is a great time to update your beneficiaries for the life insurance. Beneficiary information can be updated online.
- Bothwell Rocks employee wellness forms are due to Human Resources by 5 p.m. Nov. 30. The forms can be found on the IntraWeb; if you participate in the wellness program, please print, complete and submit both forms to HR by that date.
- Human Resources is arranging for an AFLAC representative to be at the hospital at a later date.

INFLUENZA VACCINATION POLICY

As the CDC recommends that "Health care personnel, including all paid and unpaid persons working in healthcare settings who have the potential for exposure to patients and/or to infectious materials" receive the influenza vaccine, the Infection Prevention/Control Committee has passed changes to the policy for the Annual Influenza Vaccine for Bothwell employees.

Like the previous policy, all employees, volunteers and physicians will be offered the vaccination to help protect our patients. Again employees will be able to decline the vaccination if there is documented reason they should not receive it.

This year the policy provides exemptions for certain medical conditions that will be confirmed by the employee's primary care provider with exemption forms the provider will send directly to Employee Health. Religious exemptions will also have a form that will provide verification of the employee religious reason by the clergy or religious leader to be sent directly to Employee Health.

As before, those with a documented exemption will be required to don a mask during the influenza season.

Noncompliance with the policy results in repercussions that include but are not limited to time off without pay for employees and temporary loss of privileges for volunteers, students, vendors, contracted and medical staff during the influenza season.

Appointments are required, and patients can make appointments by calling (660) 829-8888 and mentioning free mammo day.




I UNITED WAY DAY OF ACTION
