I am pleased to announce that **Marvin Smoot** is our new Vice President of Clinic Operations.

As you may know, we worked with Eide Bailly, an external search firm to identify candidates for this position. Seventy five people expressed interest and 29 were interviewed by Eide Bailly. Twelve candidates were presented to the Senior Leadership Team for review, and I interviewed 10 from that list. From that 10, five individuals were brought onsite for a day and a half of activities. This time was spent visiting several clinics, including Warsaw, having lunch with all direct reports, spending time with SLT, meeting with Dr. Todd to discuss the physician residency program, touring some hospital-based clinics, and eating dinner with physician and APP leaders.

After discussing the candidates with the rest of SLT and getting feedback from those who met with them, I am confident Marvin will be a wonderful fit for our team and bring experience and enthusiasm to his new role. Several people described him as experienced with great listening and communication skills. Others also liked him for his approachability and ability to connect with people, demonstrated community involvement, strategic thinking and suggested he would be a "great face" for Bothwell especially for provider and staff recruitment.

BENEFITS OPEN ENROLLMENT IS NOV. 6 - NOV. 24

What's new in 2024?

- Rates for the Standard and Premium plans are changing slightly
- A \$20 mental health visit copay is being added for providers in the Health Cooperative of Missouri network, and a \$50 copay is being added for providers in Freedom Select/Health Link/First Health networks.
- Two new plans are being added:
 - » Cigna Preferred Provider Organization (PPO)
 - » Cigna Health Savings Account (HSA)
- PAYTIENT line of credit card
 - Employees can sign up for the Paytient card that has a \$1,500 credit limit that can be used to pay for health, dental, vision, pharmacy or veterinary expenses over time no fees or credit check required
 - >>> Employees can choose a repayment plan length of up to 36 months through payroll deduction or from personal bank account
- Employee health certificate
 - \$250 certificate for benefits-eligible employees not on a Bothwell health insurance plan to use toward Bothwell services

2024 HEALTH INSURANCE PPO AND HSA PLANS

Preferred Provider Organization (PPO) plans help patients pay less by using a provider within the plan's network. You are still able to use providers outside of the network for an additional cost.

A Health Savings Account (HSA) allows you to set aside funds on a pre-tax basis to pay for qualified medical expenses. Though HSA funds generally cannot be used to pay premiums, you can lower your out-of-pocket health care costs by using it for other expenses including deductibles, copayments and coinsurances



FLU VACCINES

Important Dates and Information

The flu vaccine is available and employees are **required** to either receive the vaccine or request an exemption if you do not already have one. There are several options for getting your flu shot this year:

From Employee Health

- Visit Employee Health Nurse Rita Mergen, LPN, in her office on the hospital's ground floor from 6:30 am to 1:30 pm Mondays (through December) and from 6:30 am to 3 pm Tuesday through Friday.
- Rita also plans to visit hospital floors and departments. Email her at rmergen@brhc.org to coordinate a time.

In the Employee Pharmacy

 Visit the Employee Pharmacy on the hospital's ground floor from 7:30 to 11 am and 11:30 am to 3:30 pm Monday through Friday.

Bothwell Clinics

• Clinic staff will have their vaccinations delivered and administered by clinic staff.

From Your Provider

 If you elect to see your physician or practitioner for vaccination, provide proof to your director or Employee Health by Dec. 31. Any employee covered by this policy who fails to comply with the vaccination requirement by Dec. 31, will be suspended without pay for one week, during which they may comply and return to work. If an employee remains non-compliant at the end of the suspension period, it will be presumed the employee is resigning their employment.

Medical staff and other credentialed professionals who fail to comply with this policy may have their privileges administratively suspended until they provide proof of compliance or until the end of the influenza (October through March).





EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS NEWS

Welcome to the EP Corner!

To educate Bothwell employees on plans in the case of an emergency or crisis, "EP Corner" was created. The one-stop shop where employees can learn what to do in the event of an emergency with information straight from the EOC Quick Reference Guide. It's required to keep the guide in a visible location so it is readily accessible when needed.

Each month, we will highlight a different section from the guide and bring awareness that being prepared for emergencies is everyone's responsibility.

Let's start with a bomb threat or Code Purple.

What do I do if someone makes a bomb threat?

If you receive a telephone call where a bomb threat is made, remain calm and do not hang up. Do your best to prolong the conversation and press for as much information as possible. Complete the bomb threat checklist located on the inside left flap of the EOC guide.

Do I call 911?

After completing the bomb threat checklist, dial 5-911 and report a bomb threat. Give the operator all the information you collected on the checklist and identify yourself – give your name, address and phone number.

What if I find something suspicious that looks like a bomb?

If you discover a bomb or suspicious item, leave it untouched, dial 5-911 and secure the area until police arrive. You may be asked to assist in a search because you are familiar with the area. If so directed, evacuate your area. See your departmental evacuation plan.

What next?

After calling 911, notify your supervisor immediately, then stand by for further instructions. You will also need to turn off the Wi-Fi and all wireless devices. If it is deemed necessary to evacuate, you will be notified by your supervisor or the overhead paging system.

DO YOU KNOW?

Our new K9 team of Ringo and Mike is certified by the National Association of Professional Canine Handlers as a certified security and explosive detection team.



WORKPLACE SAFETY

Work Injury Policy and Procedures

Bothwell Regional Health Center complies with the laws of the state of Missouri regarding workers' compensation. This legislation provides for lost wages and medical expenses in the event of a work-related injury.

Medical treatment for work-related injuries is not a covered service under the Bothwell medical plan.

The Missouri workers' compensation law defines a work-related injury as "an injury that has arisen out of and in the course of employment." An injury shall be deemed work-related if:

- It is reasonably apparent, upon consideration of the circumstances, that the accident is the prevailing factor in causing the injury.
- It does not come from a hazard or risk unrelated to the employment to which workers would have been equally exposed externally in normal non-employment life.

Bothwell's work injury policy provides guidelines to be followed when an employee is injured on the job.

- Report the injury to the immediate supervisor as soon as possible.
- An Injury Report form should be completed and submitted to Human Resources within 24 hours of the injury. Forms are available on the intraweb, in each department and at Human Resources.
- The Human Resources will assist injured employees who require medical treatment.
- Injured employees are required to accept modified duty assignments if authorized by the treating physician. An employee who refuses modified duty assignments will not be eligible for lost wages.

PATIENT SAFE HANDLING INITIATIVE

Avoiding Lifting Injuries

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), manual patient handling is a common cause of work-related injuries and illness. The biggest risk factor for injury occurs when moving or repositioning patients. Five outcomes to consider when manual lifting include:

- Musculoskeletal disorders: Injuries to muscles, bones and joints can occur from a single lift or from repetitive and prolonged lifting in awkward postures or forceful motions.
- Falls: Patient injuries from a fall can occur and include fractures, burses and skin tears.
- Pressure ulcers: These can occur when skin is damaged due to prolonged pressure on skin.
- Infections: Exposure to infectious agents can occur while handling patients in close contact.
- Psychological stress: Manual lifting can be physically and emotionally damaging, resulting in stress and burnout of staff.

To decrease the risk factors above, it is recommended to use mechanical equipment and safety procedures to lift a patient instead of manual lifting. Use of lifts significantly reduces injuries related to overexertion and is safer for everyone involved.

Mechanical lifts available at the hospital include Sabina sit-to-stand, Golvo lift, Hoyer lift and overhead lifts in selected rooms. A location of the lifts and weight limits is located under the "Fall Prevention" tab on the intraweb. Please let your manager know if this equipment can't be located or if you have additional equipment needs. You can also notify your Fall Team/Patient Safe Handling team member of ideas and suggestions.

The next Fall Team/Patient Safe Handling meeting is at **2 pm on Nov. 14** in the board room with the option of joining via Webex.

Drs. Azan and VanDyke to Retire







Gifting Life-Saving Devices to the Community

An AED is a small, lightweight device that allows individuals and first responders to treat sudden cardiac arrest. The machine automatically analyzes the heart rhythm and when appropriate, it delivers an electrical shock to the heart to restore its normal rhythm.

Funds to purchase the devices were raised during the 2023 Wear Red for Women luncheon and auction. The committee's goal is to have AEDs in every place people work, learn, play or pray in Sedalia and Pettis County. Since the inception of the luncheon event in 2020, 72 AEDs have been placed in or committed to various locations.

The 2024 Wear Red for Women event is Feb. 23, 2024, and tickets will be on sale in January.
