Community Health Needs Assessment

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<u>Introduction</u>

The Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act requires hospitals with a 501(c)(3) tax-exempt status to complete a community health needs assessment (CHNA) once every three years. They must solicit input from persons who represent the broad interests of the community served by the hospital, including those with special knowledge of, or expertise in, public health. Bothwell Regional Health Center solicited input using modalities such as surveys and focus groups comprised of individuals representing the broad interests of the community served. A review of the 2019 CHNA and the secondary data resources available from the exploreMOhealth platform (https://exploremohealth.org/) was conducted as required of the process. This report provides a thorough description of the following.

- The community served by the hospital
- Process and methods used to conduct the assessment
- Approach used to plan, develop, and conduct the assessment
- A prioritized description of all community health needs identified through the CHNA process
- A description of the existing health care facilities and other resources within the community available to meet the community health needs identified through the CHNA

The <u>exploreMOhealth</u> ZIP Health Rankings Report reveals the top health issues in Pettis and Benton counties respectively. The following dimensions of health were assessed to identify the current gaps for individuals, community and the population within the primary service areas: demographics, social and economic factors, behaviors, clinical care/access, environmental, mortality, and quality of life. This powerful and innovative platform revealed the following top health issues based on the ZIP Health Rankings Report for the FY 2018-2020 hospital inpatient, emergency department, and outpatients diagnosed cases per 1,000.

- Chronic Diseases
 - Arthritis
 - Cancer
 - Diabetes
 - Heart disease
 - Hypertension
 - Atherosclerosis

Secondary data analysis was conducted to help identify the top issues in the primary service areas served by Bothwell Regional Health Center. Given its innovative ZIP-code level analytics capabilities the exploreMOhealth platform was used to help identify disparities at the subcounty level. Having detailed, local information on health factors and outcomes in places where Missourians live can help stakeholders and partners take the appropriate actions to create and sustain healthy communities.

Primary data derived from the survey and information gathered from the focus groups were included in the analysis and overall report to help paint a clear picture of the issues facing this region. The 2019 CHNA findings were considered in the identification and prioritization of the 2022 top issues.

Executive Summary

As a nonprofit hospital, Bothwell Regional Health Center is required by the Internal Revenue Service tax code to conduct a Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) every three years. The hospital must then use the findings from the CHNA to develop implementation strategies to address identified community needs. The purpose of the CHNA is to spur the creation of programs that improve the health of the communities served.

Bothwell collaborated with partners to collect primary and secondary data for this year's assessment to shape a picture of the health status and needs of the communities it serves. Primary data was gleaned from a survey and two focus groups that included community members interested in discussing and planning for healthier communities. Secondary data was derived from the previous year's CHNA and multiple sources on community health indicators in Bothwell's service area.

Residents live in a rural area that includes many unique qualities that allow the opportunity to experience and enhance their quality of life. Education and cultural experiences are readily available. Local secondary schools are strong and function as important cogs in their communities. State Fair Community College's (SFCC) flagship campus, located in Sedalia in Pettis County, has other locations throughout the central Missouri region. The Daum Museum of Contemporary Art at SFCC and the Liberty Center Association for the Arts provide arts and entertainment.

People seeking outdoor recreation can choose among many activities including a robust park system in Sedalia, biking, walking or riding on the Katy Trail, fishing in Clover Dell Lake, or fishing and water sports on nearby Truman Lake in Benton County. Sedalia is home to the Missouri State Fair, which attracts approximately 400,000 visitors annually. Opportunities for people to get involved in community activities exist in both Benton and Pettis counties.

The report that follows summarizes all data collected and highlights findings that Bothwell can use to leverage available resources and identify new opportunities to fill gaps in services and programs that keep residents in the communities healthy.

Prioritization Methodology

Upon identifying the issues in need of attention, the prioritization criteria considered the magnitude of the problem, severity of the problem, health disparities, community assets, and the ability to leverage though collaboration with existing community partnerships. This methodology was used during the focus groups prioritization process.

After a careful review of the findings of the previous CHNA, current secondary data, survey results and the focus group findings, the following priority health issues were identified.


- 1. Mental Health
- 2. Substance Use
- 3. Heart Disease and Obesity

Mental Health

Findings of the focus group meeting for both Pettis and Benton counties identified mental health as a priority health issue. A review of the recently completed CHNA survey results revealed that of the 315 respondents to this question, 46.03% reported this is the most pressing issue in their community. The 2019 CHNA identified mental health as a priority issue as well. According to the County Health Rankings and Roadmap, the ratio of mental health providers to patients in Benton County is significantly higher than the state at 1,300:1, compared to 490:1 for Missouri. As for Pettis County, the ratio is still higher than the state at 770:1, but lower than Benton County. Access to care requires not only financial coverage, but also access to providers. According to national data, nearly 30% of the population lives in a county designated as a Mental Health Professional Shortage Area. As the mental health parity aspects of the Affordable Care Act create increased coverage for mental health services, many regions continue to see increased shortages in mental health providers.

According to the 2021 Status Report on Missouri's Substance Use and Mental Health, both Pettis and Benton counties experienced an increase in the number of individuals who received psychiatric services when presented with anxiety and fear disorders, bipolar mood disorder, depressive mood disorder, developmental and age-related disorders, impulse control and conduct disorder, personality disorders, schizophrenia and psychotic disorders, trauma, and stress related disorder. A review of the top emergency department (ED) diagnoses revealed several mental health related conditions such as anxiety disorder and suicidal ideation. See the appendix for more details.

A review of MHA's Health Equity dashboards (https://web.mhanet.com/health-equity-dashboards/) provided a summary of the largest disparities in hospital claims-based health outcomes and health factors between different demographic groups within Pettis and Benton counties. On the following page is a screenshot depicting the top four behavioral health disparities for White and Black or African Americans in Pettis and Benton counties. On the same note, it shows the top mental health issues with the highest number of unique patients diagnosed.




Substance Use

Focus group meeting findings for both Pettis and Benton counties identified substance abuse as a priority health issue. The recent CHNA survey showed that of the 315 respondents, 186 reported use of illegal substances was one of the most pressing issues in the primary service area covered by Pettis and Benton counties. On the same note, 103 felt that prescription medication abuse was a pressing issue. According to the 2021 County Health Rankings data from 2017-2019 for the drug overdose measure, Benton County had 21 deaths while Pettis County had 10.

It is worth noting that while drug overdose deaths are an important indicator of the size of prescription and illicit drug use, small numbers of deaths can result in unreliable and suppressed estimates at the county level, even with multiple years of combined data. Drug overdose deaths are a leading contributor to premature death and are largely preventable. The United States currently is experiencing an epidemic of drug overdose deaths. Since 2000, the rate of drug overdose deaths has increased by 137% nationwide. Opioids contribute largely to drug overdose deaths; since 2000, there has been a 200% increase in deaths involving opioids (opioid pain relievers and heroin). The 2019 CHNA identified substance use as a top issue and evidently continues to be a priority in the 2022 CHNA based on the data gathered from multiple sources.

A review of MHA's <u>Health Equity dashboards</u> provided a summary of the largest disparities in hospital claims-based health outcomes and health factors between different demographic

groups within Pettis and Benton counties. This dashboard identifies the top three risk behaviors with the highest disparities between White and Black or African Americans.



Heart Disease and Obesity

A review of the primary survey results reveals that obesity was among the top health problems identified. Of the 315 individuals who completed the survey, 43% believed it was a problem among adults while 32% indicated it was a problem among children and teenagers. A further review reveals about 45% of respondents reported being told by their doctor they had high blood pressure and needed to lose weight for health reasons. On the same note, 22% reported to have been told they had high blood sugar or diabetes. All these health factors align with the secondary data, thus requiring a comprehensive approach in addressing them through diet and exercise. When asked about the types of health education services most needed in the community, diet and/or exercise was in the top categories. A review of the top 10 ED diagnoses, DRG's from the ED – inpatient, and observation diagnosis revealed a few metrics related to heart disease and other chronic conditions.

Secondary data supports the focus on chronic conditions as the general strategies deployed will be key to improving health outcomes in multiple areas beyond heart disease. The exploreMOhealth data reveals the following top chronic conditions namely, arthritis, cancer, diabetes, heart disease, hypertension and atherosclerosis, among others. The Robert Wood Johnson County Health Rankings 2021 report denotes both Pettis and Benton counties have higher rates of adult obesity at 41 and 34% respectively compared to the state rate of 33%. It is important to note that while Benton County has maintained the 2019 obesity rate, the Pettis

County rate has increased by 5%. Both have a higher percent of physical inactivity compared to the state.

These health factors have a strong upstream influence on health outcomes of mortality and morbidity. According to the County Health Rankings report derived from the exploreMOhealth platform, the percent of the adult population age 20 and older with a body mass index greater than or equal to 30 was 33.5% and 37% for Benton and Pettis counties respectively. County level study survey data from the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services further reveals a higher percent of respondents reported their health was in fair or poor status in Benton County compared to Pettis County. From a population health management standpoint, there is a great opportunity for care coordination between health care organizations and community partners.



2019 Rate of Health Outcomes: Quality of Life for Missouri Counties





2019 Rate of Health Factors: Behaviors for Missouri Counties





2019 Rate of Health Outcomes: Quality of Life for Missouri Counties



Recommendations

Identifying specific populations and specific health behaviors and health outcomes that are influenced by the top three health issues will enable providers and the community to focus resources and attention on priority areas. Of greatest importance is access to coordinated care to promote primary and secondary prevention and chronic care management.

A myriad of strategies may be employed to address these seemingly disparate health issues. For example, work with community citizens, partner organizations and providers to educate about the prevalence of chronic conditions such as heart diseases, diabetes, cancer, and arthritis, among others, is extremely important. This by itself provides a platform to promote primary prevention through physical activity and healthy eating; implementing simple screening tools in organizations and primary care settings to identify people at risk of diabetes; and incorporate care coordination with specialists to reduce complications such as heart disease. Although implementation may be broad, focused implementation and evaluation must target specific populations or organizations to determine the effect. Health status and health outcomes will not change notably within a three-year period across a community. However, health outcomes such as preventable hospitalizations for short-term complications of diabetes may suggest improved access and care coordination within primary care settings.

Addressing mental health and substance abuse must be a long-term strategy. Many factors, including lack of access, stigmatization and factors contributing to all substance abuse, including prescription, illegal alcohol and tobacco use, require the cooperation of many partner organizations. Using the power of new innovative data platforms like exploreMOhealth and the MHA Health Equity dashboards will help Bothwell Regional Health Center and partners identify the prevalence of diseases at the ZIP code level while highlighting the disparities that may need attention. This level of specificity and granularity will help the hospital target interventions with the needed precision. This will also help target the scarce resources where they are needed most, thus taking the necessary steps in promoting health equity. Recognizing the medical and non-medical factors of health as identified by the survey, focus group discussion and secondary data will assist the care teams customize each patient's unique needs.

Community Defined

Bothwell Regional Health Center's primary service area includes Pettis and Benton counties. It also extends into a 40-mile radius that reaches six contiguous counties: Saline, Johnson, Henry, Moniteau, Morgan and Cooper. Specific data was not collected for the secondary market area.

Community Characteristics

Bothwell Regional Health Center serves an area diverse in agriculture and manufacturing industries. Pettis County is home to State Fair Community College, which offers a variety of academic programs including a number of health sciences programs such as dental hygiene, health information technology, medical laboratory technician, nursing, pharmacy technician, respiratory therapy, diagnostic medical sonography, medical assisting, nurse aide, occupational therapy assistant, phlebotomy and behavioral science.

Tourism in Pettis County is driven by the presence of the Missouri State Fair, which hosts about 400,000 visitors during the annual event each August. Additionally, the fairgrounds are the venue for many events throughout the year that attracts visitors from across the region and country. Other fairs and festivals are held throughout the year in the county that foster community and attract visitors. The 240-mile Katy Trail is the country's longest recreational rail trail and bisects Sedalia. The trail attracts people of all ages who enjoy nature, exercise and recreation.

Located on U.S. Highways 50 and 65, Pettis County enjoys the comforts of rural communities with urban life and the Lake of the Ozarks within an hour's drive. It is a community rich in arts and entertainment with the Daum Museum of Contemporary Art located on the State Fair Community College campus and the Liberty Center Association for the Arts located in downtown Sedalia. The Sedalia community boasts a healthy parks system with seven parks, two outdoor aquatic centers, walking trails and a skate park. A new community center opened in March 2022 and features an indoor aquatic facility, community center rooms, convention space, basketball/volleyball/pickleball courts, a fitness area, party rooms, child watch area, an indoor playground, and serves as the home of the Sedalia Senior Center.

A spirit of giving runs deep in Pettis County. Beginning with its foundation, Sedalia has been home to people who know the importance of giving back to the community. Even Bothwell Regional Health Center, which opened in 1930, was the result of an effort by John Homer Bothwell to build a hospital in Sedalia. He pledged \$150,000 in seed money and encouraged the community to also support the project.

The community has strong foundations benefiting education and health care, a United Way organization that allocates more than a half-million dollars to community agencies each year, and Open Door Ministries, which serves as a food pantry and thrift shop and provides financial assistance to low-income families.

Benton County includes the communities of Lincoln, Warsaw and Cole Camp. It offers German heritage, hunting and outdoor activities and lake life. Truman Lake and the Harry S. Truman Dam and Reservoir Visitor Center attract visitors and amenities attract retirees.

Harbor Village - a project of Katy Trail Community Health, the Warsaw Senior Center and Pathways Community Behavioral Health - is a 24,800-square-foot facility in Warsaw that houses multiple health and social services. These services include personal care managers, senior meals, adult care programs, recreational and educational programming for adults, wellness programs, financial and insurance assistance, and an entrepreneurial business center.

Other Health Services

In addition to Bothwell Regional Health Center, Pettis County is served by Katy Trail Community Health, a federally qualified health center, the Pettis County Health Center and several private practice clinics. Bothwell's services include a 108-bed hospital and more than 20 family medicine and specialty clinics. Specialty care available in Sedalia includes behavioral health, cardiology, obstetrics/gynecology, ear/nose/throat, orthopedics, general surgery, neurology, oncology (hematology and radiation), rheumatology, pulmonology, nephrology, pain management, sleep medicine, urology, podiatry and wound. Several privately owned therapy/rehab treatment centers are available as well as a private diagnostic center.

In Benton County, Bothwell has three family medicine clinics. Some specialists visit clinics to provide on-site services. The Benton County-Warsaw area is also served by Katy Trail Community Health, Golden Valley Memorial Healthcare's primary care clinic and the Benton County Health Department. Between January 1 – December 22, 2021, Benton County Health Department administered the following vaccination series: 116 DtaP/TD/Tdap; 4 Hep B; 22 MMR; 20 Polio; and 30 Varicella.

Occupations by Projected Growth

According to the Missouri Economic Research and Information Center, the primary service areas for Bothwell Regional Health Center are in their west central region, comprised of 13 counties. The two largest cities in this region are Sedalia and Warrensburg. Economic data is gathered to gain insights and provide key information necessary to understand the economic status of the region. This information is in turn used by community members, employers and policy makers to identify gaps, thus helping strategize ways to address them as required for economic stability. The top three industries employing residents in this region are health care, social assistance and manufacturing respectively. The largest government employer is the University of Central Missouri followed by other private employers such as Walmart, Tyson Poultry and ConAgra Foods.

The West Central Region is projected to have almost 11,000 total job openings each year between 2018 and 2028. Total openings comprise growth openings, exit openings, and transfer openings. Growth openings are the result of an occupation growing between the base year and the projected year. Exit openings occur when a worker leaves the workforce entirely, such as retirement. Transfer openings occur when a worker leaves their occupation for a different one.

Of the top 20 occupations with the most total openings, three are in the Food Preparation and Serving Related major occupation group. The occupations of General and Operations Managers, Truck Drivers and Secondary School Teachers have large numbers of projected total openings, as well as above average wages for the West Central Region.



Primary Research Process

Public Survey

A survey instrument for quantitative data and multiple focus groups for qualitative data was employed to gather primary data from the market area.

Survey Layout and Design

The Community Health Needs Assessment Survey was a questionnaire-style survey based on a template provided by the Missouri Hospital Association. The 66-question survey contained three sections: (1) health behaviors, (2) medical care and services, and (3) demographics. With one exception, all were multiple-choice questions. One open-ended question, "What health or community services should Bothwell Regional Health Center provide that are currently not available?" was used to identify gaps in services. The demographic section was placed at the end of the survey to head off any barriers respondents may have felt when answering questions about income, age and insurance status.

Methodology

The survey was available online at brhc.org/survey, and paper copies were widely distributed throughout Pettis and Benton counties. The survey period was January 9 through February 9, 2022. To incentivize participation, respondents were entered into a drawing for a \$100 Visa gift card. The goal was to collect enough completed surveys to be statistically significant for the combined population of both counties (approximately 62,000) with a 5% margin of error. This meant at least 382 completed surveys were needed; a total of 348 were received. Paper surveys were entered into the same online survey service used to collect online responses to easily analyze results. The survey was translated into Spanish and Russian and paper copies were provided upon request.

Summary of Key Findings

Key findings from the CHNA survey results from 2019 and 2022 reveal similarities in the demographics of the people completing the survey in Pettis and Benton counties respectively. Compared to the 2019 results, a slightly higher percent of males completed the survey while a lower percent of females participated in 2022. While both survey periods have a higher White population completion rate at 95%, it aligns well with the secondary data racial breakdown in the region which is approximately 93%. A slightly higher percent of Blacks completed the survey at 3.19% in 2022 compared to 1.46% in 2019.


Looking at insurance coverage, there was a higher number of participants who indicated they were covered by Medicare at 25.08% in 2022 compared to 19.96% in 2019. While Medicaid and private insurance coverage were well within range of each other during the two survey periods, there was a notable decline in the survey participants reporting employer coverage at 75.27% in 2019 compared to 64.95% in 2022.

A slightly higher percent of survey takers reported to have graduate level education in 2022 at 14.06% compared to 9.67% in 2019.

Primary data are an important part of community health needs assessment. These data can fill in gaps in secondary data sources, highlight critical issues or concerns, and provide opportunities for community members to actively engage in the community health assessment process.


Survey results further reveal the top pressing health issues in their community are mental health, access to care, substance use/drug abuse, obesity, cancer, diabetes, heart disease, and lack of dental care. When asked about a preference on health education focus, the top responses were drug and alcohol abuse, diet and exercise, stress management and smoking prevention. Most of these findings coincide with the survey results of the 2016 and 2019 community health needs assessments.

Results from the most recently completed community health assessment survey show about 45% of respondents mentioned being told by a physician they have high blood pressure.




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
Current community health assessment survey results depict that about 43% of respondents have been told by a physician to lose weight for health reasons.

Per the graphic below about 63% of the 343 individuals who responded to the survey question are trying to lose weight.








When asked about how long it has been since they last visited a doctor for their routine checkup about 83% of 330 individuals reported they have seen their doctor within one year and 9% within two years.

How long has it been since you last visited a doctor for a routine check up? A routine check-up is a general visit, not a visit for a specific injury, illness or condition.



About 85% of survey respondents indicated they have access to a dentist.




Related to access to a substance abuse counselor, 27% of survey respondents indicated they have access while an overwhelming 73% indicated they do not.


Approximately 30% of 326 survey respondents who responded to this question reported difficulty finding a doctor to treat specific illnesses within the past two years.

2022 Focus Group Summary

As part of the Community Health Needs Assessment, two focus groups were held (one in Pettis County and one in Benton County) to gather insight on health information and perceptions from a variety of people in each community. Focus groups were carved into small groups in order to facilitate deeper discussion. Participants were asked the same questions that focused on a vision for a healthy community, identifying the biggest health issues, why there are problems, potential strategies for improvement, challenges or barriers to implementing strategies, and Bothwell's role in implementation.

Detailed summaries from each focus group are included below.

Pettis County

Pettis County focus group members were selected to participate based on their organization's role in the community. Health care administration and leadership members represented Bothwell Regional Health Center, Katy Trail Community Health and Pettis County Health Center. In addition to health care representatives, the group included participants from city and community partners including the City of Sedalia, Pettis County, State Fair Community College, and area nursing homes.

Members first had the opportunity to imagine their vision for a healthy community that included wide access to services that promote a healthy lifestyle such as safe drinking water, a sense of safety, affordable and decent housing, adequate public transportation, diverse industry and workforce, strong educational system, sidewalks, active parks system and accessible greenspace, exercise facilities, and a strong primary care system. The Heckart Community in Sedalia opened since the last CHNA, which all participants agreed is a major step toward promoting a healthy lifestyle and could serve as a nucleus for additional health initiatives.

Many specific health issues were identified as the biggest challenges in the community including substance abuse, mental health issues, obesity, heart disease, suicide (especially youth), and accessible dental care. Participants believed many of these issues can be tied to social issues such as generational poverty, lack of education and awareness, lack of healthy options and support resources or knowledge on how to utilize them, lack of focus on healthy social norms, and concerns about the strength of partnerships with local schools.

Implementation strategies discussed to combat the identified issues included having free places to exercise, free educational health classes, better connecting people to additional resources, helping people overcome the stigma of asking for help, mentoring programs, life skills training, and partnering with public health and schools to intervene earlier to stunt or stop the cycle of poor health choices.

Barriers to implementation include a "hands-off" parenting style that appears more prevalent, continuous cycles of family trauma, silos between programs and organizations, late intervention from schools, lack of understanding of obesity and health, language barriers among minority populations, literacy differences, funding limitations, overcoming community inertia, and a downturn in the number of people interested in health care careers.

Participants see Bothwell as a credible and authoritative leader that is well-positioned to serve as a community hub. Bothwell should leverage this position to pull together diverse groups and create partnerships among other organizations that impact health, e.g., public health, secondary and post-secondary education, industry, and community organizations that create a greater sense of interconnectedness in the community.

Benton County

Benton County focus group members were individuals from local government, businesses and the community that includes the cities of Warsaw, Cole Camp and Lincoln. Health care administration and leadership members represented Bothwell Regional Health Center and the Benton County Health Department. Participants answered the same questions as the Pettis County group in the same small-group format.

This group's vision for a healthy community included available health care for the entire community, robust education options, social and recreational opportunities both indoors and outdoors, presenting healthy choices, education and options to children at an early age, and residents who are socially connected to churches and schools.

Many community health issues were identified including an aging population, food insecurity, teen pregnancy, substance abuse, obesity, mental health issues and heart problems. Members believe many of the issues are problems because of a lack of education and transportation, easy access to drugs, poor behavior or life choices, misinformation, fear or lack of trust in the system and lack of money.

Implementation strategies discussed to combat the identified issues included working with schools and public health to create an early intervention cycle of education, understanding and trust, starting more conversations through organized focus groups that would surface and normalize challenges, creating a mentor program to connect generations, establishing a nursing 411 phone line for rural areas, creating a transportation coalition, offering more community education, and evening and/or weekend access to health care.

Social issues that are barriers to improvements include dependence on government assistance, social media use as a distraction, an alarming lack of work ethic among some young people, a higher proportion of low-income residents, and a lack of adequate support networks. Process challenges mentioned included Bothwell's current use of a centralized scheduling system.

Participants see Bothwell's role as a facilitator to create better communication, involvement and education by collaborating with others in the community to develop educational programs in the schools and in communities. Several participants mentioned they do not know the Bothwell clinicians in their communities or what services are offered so there is the opportunity for greater awareness in this county.

Secondary Research Process

Secondary data derived from various local, state and national data sources was reviewed and analyzed. Findings were key in helping identify the gaps needing attention in Pettis and Benton counties respectively. Results from the previous community health assessments completed in 2016 and 2019 were used as a basis for the 2022 CHNA process. As required of the process, multiple data sources were used in the secondary data analysis process. Data from the primary service areas was benchmarked against state and national data whenever possible to identify emerging trends. It is important to note that data from the exploreMOhealth health atlas was used since it provides a comprehensive and customized community health needs assessment that evaluates health factors and health outcomes across counties and ZIP codes in the primary service areas. Findings from these results will be the basis for any decision-making and will ensure that resources will be allocated where they are needed most.

Secondary Research Data

Secondary data findings revealed Pettis County has over twice the total population compared to Benton County. Both counties have a significantly lower percent of Blacks and Asians compared to state and national trends. When it comes to racial composition, Pettis County is more diverse compared to Benton County. Compared to the state and nation, both counties have significantly higher non-Hispanic White population. Between 2000 and 2010 the population in the two counties experienced an 8.26% increase. A review of population median age based on the latest five-year American Community Survey estimate shows that Benton has a significantly higher median age at 53.6 years compared to 37.8 years for Pettis County. On the same note, the state and national median age is 38.6 and 38.1 years, which is significantly lower than that of Benton County. Demographics information further reveals a significant part of Benton County is considered rural compared to Pettis County. With a total population of 61,257 between both counties, 28,823, or 47.05% of the population, is classified urban while 32,434, or 52.95%, is rural. These two counties have a higher rural population compared to the state and nation.

A careful review of the social and economic factors of population with no high school diploma shows that Benton County has a slightly higher percent population age 25 and above with no high school diploma compared to Pettis County. It is worth noting this is a change from the previously completed CHNA which showed Pettis County with a higher percent of the population in this category. Between both counties, 16.26% of the population aged 25 and older have obtained a bachelor's level degree or higher. Unfortunately, this is significantly lower than the state and national rates of 29.22% and 32.15% respectively. This indicator is important because studies have shown people with more education live longer, healthier lives than those with fewer years of schooling. Education is important not only for higher paying jobs and economic productivity, but also for saving lives and cost savings.

The per capita income, which constitutes all reported income from wages and salaries as well as income from self-employment, interest or dividends, public assistance, retirement, and other sources, was higher in Benton County compared to Pettis County. The state and national per capita income was higher than that of these two counties. Further analysis revealed that Black or African Americans in Benton County had a higher per capita income compared to their White counterparts. Blacks or African Americans in Pettis County had a significantly lower per capita income compared to Whites. The median family income based on the latest five-year American Community Survey estimates for the two counties was lower than that of the state and nation. Both Benton and Pettis County have 16.80% of individuals living in households with income below the 100% Federal Poverty Level (FPL). This indicator is especially important because poverty creates barriers to access including health services, healthy food, and other necessities that contribute to poor health status. The FPL for both counties is higher than the state and national rates of 13.68% and 13.42% respectively.

A review of the percentage of the population with insurance enrolled in Medicaid or other means-tested public health insurance in both counties reveals a higher rate in Pettis County.


This measure assesses vulnerable populations which are more likely to have multiple health access, health status and social support needs. When combined with poverty data, providers can use this measure to identify gaps in eligibility and enrollment. This metric is especially important because of the associated health disparities that result from gaps in accessibility. Both Pettis and Benton counties reported combined average is 12.51% of households receive Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefit; this is higher than the state and national trends. When it comes to food insecurity, Benton County had a slightly higher rate than Pettis County. This metric is an estimate of percentage of the population that did not have food at some point during the report year and one of the most common social determinants of health. Compared to the state and nation, both counties had significantly higher teen births per 1,000 population.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Behavioral Risk Factor Survey System, Pettis had a higher age-adjusted percent of adults aged 18 and older who self-reported lacking social and emotional support compared to Benton County. The social and emotional support metric is important because it demonstrates how they can navigate the challenges of daily life to ensure good mental health. It is also linked to educational achievement and economic stability. Benton County had a rate of 14.20% compared to Pettis County at 21.30%.

A review of Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services County Health Rankings data reveals that a higher percent of respondents reported their health was in fair or poor status in Pettis County compared to Benton County. Residents in both counties reported the same average of poor mental health days per month. Compared to Benton County, Pettis County has a slightly higher percent of adults reporting 14 or more days of poor physical health per month. Benton County has a slightly higher percent of adults reporting 14 or more days of poor mental health per month compared to Pettis County. When comparing diagnosis of diabetes, Pettis County had a higher percentage of adults aged 20 and above than Benton County. Related to diagnosis of human immunodeficiency virus (HIV), Benton County has a significantly higher number of people aged 13 years and older living with HIV infection per 100,000 population.


Both Benton and Pettis counties have continued to see an increase in smoking and hypertension diagnoses from 2017 to 2021. Reviewing the strategies, actions and activities implemented during the reporting period and continuously monitoring their effectiveness will help identify opportunities for improvement. Using the power of the readily available subcounty level data, technology, leveraging partnerships, implementing evidence-based programs, and reviewing the current processes and systems will assist Bothwell Regional Health Center in their implementation journey.

Based on inpatient/outpatient and emergency department diagnosis data, there was an 8% increase in the smoking diagnosis during this time period; see the graph that follows. During the same reporting period, there was a 22% increase in hypertension in Benton County.

The results of this secondary data analysis show Pettis and Benton counties have similar issues warranting a collaborative, well-coordinated, multifaceted approach to address the common problems together. Despite the significant differences on total population, the counties have more in common in health outcomes, factors, behaviors, social and economic factors among other categories included in this report. Sharing these results with the two primary service areas and looking for areas of collaboration will help address the underlying problems required to ensure healthy communities. Reviewing the secondary data closely and capturing the missing elements in the primary data collection process will assist Bothwell Regional Health Center and the community at large identify opportunities and current gaps to be addressed. Identifying the key partners that should be engaged earlier in the process will be critical in ensuring a successful prioritization and implementation of the CHNA.

The following data from the exploreMOhealth database was used to aggregate secondary data analysis to identify which health outcomes and health factors are most important in Pettis and Benton counties. It was extremely important in helping to generate this customized Community Health Needs Assessment using county- and ZIP-level data on demographics, socioeconomic status, risk factors, preventive practices, health conditions and environment. With the changing landscape in health care, new population health strategies are refocusing how care is delivered. However, to understand why poor emotional or physical health occurs in some communities, health care providers should be looking upstream to the numerous factors that lead to positive or negative health outcomes. These factors include social, environmental and contextual determinants. These are community factors that create an intersection of traditional health care and public health. Integrating social determinants in care delivery will ensure that the entire care team is using a holistic approach that considers both medical and non-medical factors of health. Using the power of data available through platforms like exploreMOhealth and MHA's Health Equity dashboards will help magnify and stratify data, thus assisting Bothwell Regional Health Center implement strategies and actions with the needed precision.









































Lymphatic Cancer Diagnoses Occurring in a Hospital Setting per 1,000 Total Population by ZIP Code, ZHR 2020







<u>Baby Think it Over</u>: Our Baby Think It Over program uses computerized dolls to simulate what it is like to care for an infant. The program also promotes abstinence and infant safety. Baby Think It Over simulators and curriculum materials are available for loan to schools, youth groups, scouts, and other teen-serving organizations/programs.

MRCC Food Co-op: Partnering with the Missouri Rural Crisis Center, once each month we can offer people approximately \$40 worth of groceries for \$22. Co-op members pay an annual membership fee of \$10 and the \$22 monthly co-op fee each month they receive an order of food which includes bread, produce, paper products, and canned goods, as well as MRCC's own Patchwork Farms meat products. Members may request multiple orders at the same price per order. Additional meat may be ordered at reasonable rates. All participants of the food cooperative must be current MRCC members. Anyone may participate, regardless of income.

<u>The Community Closet:</u> PCCP has a supply of personal care and household items donated by the community that are available to people in need who are our clients or are referred by a partner agency. Donations of diapers, wipes, hygiene items, toilet paper, paper towels, Kleenex, feminine products, etc. are always welcome throughout the year.

<u>Community Resource Directory:</u> We publish a director of community resources that is available in our lobby at any time. Please contact our Executive Assistant to have information added or updated for your agency.

<u>PCCP Housing Services</u>: PCCP receives grants from various sources to assist people who are literally homeless, or imminently homeless, in securing stable housing. Skilled case managers interview potential clients to determine whether the client meets the funder's requirements for assistance. Assistance may be provided, as funds are available, to people who qualify. Determination is made on a case-by-case basis.

<u>P.R.O.P. - Putting Roofs Over People</u>: The branch of our housing efforts where PCCP staff members meet with other social service agencies, schools, churches, businesses and individuals to discuss efforts and needs around homelessness in order to provide coordination around housing and other assistance for meeting needs of vulnerable populations.

<u>Homeless Hotline - (660) 287-2228:</u> We serve people who are literally and chronically homeless through the Coordinated Entry hotline serving 9 counties in west central Missouri (Johnson, Lafayette, Pettis, Saline, Benton, Bates, Cass, Henry, and St. Clair). Call the hotline to begin the intake process.

<u>Pillars of Pettis County:</u> This is a group of community partners who are working to find a viable solution to provide transitional housing for people who are homeless in Pettis County. The meetings are held in the PCCP conference room.

<u>MO Reentry Process Steering Group</u>: Community partners share and coordinate resources around housing, education, family support, employment, mental health, and other issues. All with an interest in reentry are welcome to attend. Meetings are held on the first Monday of each month at noon in the PCCP conference room.

<u>Multicultural Services:</u> Cherishing diversity of our residents, PCCP strives to heighten cultural awareness and appreciation.

<u>Family Nutrition Education</u> (Spanish & English): Our educators help families learn how a well-balanced meal promotes child development and adult health. University of MO Extension is our partner.

ALL ADULTS IN HOUSEHOLD MUST COMPLETE AN APPLICATION

To process an application for assistance, we MUST first have all the following:

- 1. Photo ID for everyone 18 or older in the home
- 2. Social Security Cards for everyone in the home
- 3. Proof of Income (ALL that apply)
 - a) Paystubs for the most recent 30 days
 - b) Child Support Payment Verification
 - c) Self Employed last tax return
 - d) Bank statement printout for 6 months (average balance)
 - e) Unemployment Income Verification
 - f) TANF Verification
 - g) Social Security Award Letter current year
 - h) All other income
- 4. Eviction Notice/Utility Shut-Off Notice
- 5. Verification of Delinquency (we provide as necessary)
- 6. Current lease (signed & dated)
- 7. Rental Assistance Agreement (we provide as necessary)

To provide housing or utility assistance, all housing units **MUST** pass a housing inspection. The unit must be **SAFE, DECENT**, and **SANITARY**.

- o All utilities MUST be on & working.
- o All windows, doors, lights, and plumbing must work.
- o The unit must have working smoke detectors.
- o No broken or boarded up windows or doors.

Please note: No guarantees of assistance will be made until all documents are provided and approved, and the unit has passed our housing inspection.
